## Any aspects of the school you would like to see improved:

Yes, I feel for reception children plus first time school mum slightly over whelmed. It's difficult to engage with your child about what they learnt at school especially at such a young age and I feel on the parents evenings they were rushed and I was very dis heartened and upset to be told my son was struggling and will struggle into year 1 if phonics don't improve. I feel the school could improve by interacting with me as a parent more and explaining where about his level is and what should be expected from such a young age as how are you know suppose to this information?

I think reception this year has been great for both my children sadly don't feel the same throughout the school hopefully \*\*\*\*\* enjoys her time throughout

Asthma care; my child has informed me of at least 2 occasions when they were struggling with breathing but no adult noticed. I have also collected my child at the end of the day and they have been wheezing heavily and should obviously have received their inhaler much earlier. I have impressed upon my child the importance of asking for their inhaler when needed but they are still a little young to take charge of their own asthma care. I appreciate how busy the adults are and have always mentioned to them when extra attention may be required. I feel a little extra training/knowledge may benefit them all. I will raise this individually after our next paediatric hospital review. There doesn't seem to be sufficient time and energy to ensure each child is working to their potential.
