Dear Parents,

The school year started with great excitement as we welcomed the new reception children into school for the first time. They all looked very smart in their new school uniform and while many were brave and confident there were a few who understandably were nervous. Over the last week I have seen all of them grow in confidence and settle into the pattern of school life. We have also welcomed in a number of new children in other year groups and I am pleased to say that as always it is lovely to see children at St Bridget's being so friendly and welcoming to our new pupils.

During the first week I have heard children share stories about their summer. Many of them have been very lucky and have had wonderful experiences which they will never forget. Sadly, some of our families have experienced bereavement or received very upsetting news. The circumstances for each family are different and my staff work hard to ensure that life in school for these children is as normal as it can be. Naturally, our thoughts and prayers are with those families.

Our first assembly of the year was an opportunity for us to think about why we are a Rights Respecting School. Mrs McCarthy shared with the children our wonderful video which was completed in the summer and shows some of the work the children learnt about in the last academic year. She also raised our awareness of the work of Martin Luther King and has set a project for all the classes to find out some more information about him for our next assembly. Mrs McCarthy also shared the experiences of her family growing up in America at the time of the Civil Rights Movement. Today Mr Owen, father of Isabella and Grace came to speak to all the children in assembly about raising money for Cancer Research. He is attempting to complete a 220 mile bike ride as well as complete the Great North Run. We are going to support his fundraising efforts on Monday 16th September. Children are allowed to wear accessories that are black and white. Over the summer we were fortunate to have a new Gazebo installed in the Key Stage 2 playground. My thanks to the Parents Association for funding this and particular thanks to Mrs Jones who helped ensure the project was a success. We now have a fantastic addition to our playground which in time we will develop into a useful outside













area for learning. I would ask parents to ensure that their children do not use the Gazebo as a climbing frame at the end of the day.
