

Dear Parents/Carers,

I can only imagine how difficult this week has been for you. On Monday I welcomed everyone back to school and by the evening at 8pm I was hearing the national message of we are all going into lockdown. This was not good news for anyone and for some families this has been devasting news on a number of different levels. We have been asked to open school to vulnerable children and critical workers, as defined by the government, which has meant a limit on numbers. In spite of this we have been overwhelmed with applications. We have dealt with nearly 200 applications not all of which we have been able to accept. To put this in context, school is nearly 40% full after 3 days. In the last lock down, we reached this figure after 3 months. While we have learnt to successfully manage health and safety in school, I believe the school is under far greater strain and threat of outbreak this time around.

BBC Two Education offer during lockdown

The new offer from the BBC will ensure all children can access curriculum-based learning, even if they don't have access to the internet.
