

Dear Parents/Carers,

Earlier opening feedback

Having reviewed and revised the start of school time to 8:45am we have received positive feedback regarding some congestion and parking issues. We will continue to review this situation as we progress through the term. Thank you for your continued support and consideration for local residents when bringing your children to school.

Covid update

As you know there have been higher than average numbers of Covid infection in Class 12. I have contacted the Wirral Covid helpline and they have reviewed the measures we have in school. We have introduced further measures for class 12 which include:

- Separate toilets
- Reduced movement around the school and the class are acting as a bubble.
- Hand sanitiser on each table
- Increased cleaning
- Increased ventilation

Fortunately, these measures seem to have slowed infection across the school. In most other classes we only have 1 or 2 cases and none in the younger classes in school.

The recommendation from the Wirral helpline is that all family members of our Year 6 children take a PCR test to prevent further infection spread and help to identify any asymptomatic cases.

I would like to thank the families in Year 6 for working with school to help limit the outbreak and everyone at St. Bridget's wishes all those impacted a speedy recovery.

Curriculum update

My staff and I have taken the opportunity over the last few weeks to review how our curriculum design and vision has progressed over the last few years. Delivering on the ideas and direction provided by all stakeholders, including parent consultation groups, governors and the children themselves, whilst ensuring our children can fulfil our vision statement is no easy task but has become a great source of pride for our school.

















Our pillars of Our World, Our Community and Our Environment have provided meaningful contexts for learning our National Curriculum. These of course were derived from our Vision Statement and our school values continue to run through our curriculum. Social Justice and STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths) have inspired some wonderful work despite being impacted by the pandemic and we look forward to exploring the concept of Equality this coming Spring term.





It is also refreshing to hear the Education Secretary speak of an Eco-curriculum in the near future, especially as we have been developing our own since we helped to launch Coast to Country alongside several local schools back in 2018. The children spoke overwhelmingly passionately about wanting conservation and climate change taught and addressed in their curriculum which has been the case since. Recently Mr Neal and I addressed a national conference for educators about the Coast to Country project.





Watching the children engage and thrive with our curriculum model has been a pleasure and we continue to review and refine it in order to provide the best possible learning opportunities for our children.
