Dear Parents,

Assembly Themes

External safeguarding Audit

You will pleased to hear that after a recent safeguarding audit the school met all the essential criteria and exceeded the standards in many areas. We take all aspects of safeguarding very seriously. The auditor was really impressed with the children's behaviour at lunchtime and spoke to lots of children about how they feel about school.

Book fair

A huge thanks for all those children who took part in the Readathon. In total St Bridget's have raised a fantastic £496.05 which will go to the following charities: Read Well, CLIC Sargent (for Children with cancer), Roald Dahl's Marvellous Children's Charity and Together for Short Lives. Thank you to all of the staff who supported the book fair and for those families that visited us. We raised over £800 which means we receive 60% commission! Class teachers will use the money to update their class libraries.

Election Day Safety

This Thursday is Election Day and school will be open as the voting will take place in the Church Centre. This is the first time this has happened. I expect there may be some more traffic around the local area and I would ask that you take extra care coming to and from school. In particular, St. Bridget's Lane may be used more than usual by the public and this may present some added challenges during drop and pick up times.
