January has been an exciting month at St. Bridget's and the recent weather has certainly made it more challenging, but I would like to thank everyone for taking extra care and arriving at school safely. A number of parents have expressed their thanks to our caretaker, Mr Wilkins, who has worked additional hours to clear the pathways into school. Mr Jenkins our cleaner, who arrives just before 5am, has also had to overcome challenges today, as all of the school locks had frozen and his keys snapped when he tried opening up the gates. Year 5 have continued swimming this week and I would also like to thank all of the parents who walk with the children down to pool. Your help is invaluable and much appreciated.

Climate Action and Global Goals

Earlier this month we started some of our work on Climate Action and Global Goals. Mr Neal and Mr Ryan challenged children to think about how they could lessen their impact on the environment. In particular, we have started to think about single use plastics. Mrs Mountain our catering supervisor has also taken up the challenge. For a long time we have worked on reducing food waste but this term we are reducing our use of plastic straws. For a trial period, we are serving just water at lunchtime rather than fruit juice. This has had a significant impact on the amount of waste each day, approximately 7000 less straws and cartons per month. Most of the children are comfortable with this change, there are a few that would prefer juice (as would I), but it is a small change that is making a bigger difference.

I would also like to make a special mention for three of our Yr2 pupils, Katie, Eve and Isobel and Euan from Yr3 who gave up their time last Saturday to help 'The High Tidiers' litter pick in the West Kirby area. Your efforts are very much appreciated by both the school and wider community.

Curriculum Development – Chester Zoo and Coast to Country

Increasingly, over the year, but in the last half of the summer term we are working with Chester Zoo and developing our own environmental project called Coast to Country. We are one of the lead schools for this project and we launch our vision and ideas at the Deeside Headteacher Conference. We now have 17 primary schools and four secondary schools who want to take part and this will culminate in joint work in the form art exhibitions, IT collaborations and an epic beach/park clean! This project has attracted a number of private companies that would like to show support, have expertise or would like to be involved. So far, this has included waste management companies, IT, car companies and many more. Please speak to me or send me a message if you are interested in joining in.

How can you help? Some ideas to consider at home

- It would be great if you could talk to your children about recycling and consider how much you recycle at home. What do you recycle at work?
- Do you remember to take your reusable shopping bags?
- How else do you avoid using plastic or check that you only use recycled plastic?
- Do you carry a reusable coffee cup or flask? 7 million plastic-lined coffee cups are thrown away in the UK every day.
- Do you say no to plastic cutlery?
