## Building work update

The last of the building work has nearly been finished. Thank you for your patience. The children are certainly appreciating the new classes and playground. As well as providing two new reception classes and toilets, we also have a separate room for the before and after school club which has access via its own entrance. This additional class is now used as a teaching room for year 6 and we are able to provide 3 classes and 3 teachers for the large year 6 cohort of children. The project has finally linked all of our classes into one building. As an aside, in my first year of Headship at St. Bridget's we had only just moved two classes from what is now the museum and Church Centre into the school.

The last of the building company's containers will be moved on Friday so please watch out for big machinery on or near the school site. The next job is to create learning and play spaces in the infant playground. This will involve working with the Parents Association and organising playground marking so that we can identify areas which we will fence off for quiet spaces or ball games etc. We will develop this over the next term.

## **Sleepout Challenge**

Following last years success a number of the staff from St. Bridget's are taking on the Sleepout Challenge. Some of the staff will Sleepout overnight in the school hall and some of the more adventurous members of staff will sleep out in the playground under the stars or the Gazebo if there is room! This is the second year we have decided to complete the challenge. Last year the weather was kind to us, but the church bells rang all night and literally shook us awake each hour. By 5.30am we were all in school having completed the fastest commute ever. We will see what challenges this year brings, remembering that for us it is only one night.

We are completing this a week before Advent starts because of the clash with the school fair. The Advent Sleepout is a national, sponsored event to help marginalised people in England transform their lives and communities through the work of the Church Urban Fund. <u>Sleepout Challenge</u>

#### Halloween/Bonfire Night

Parents please remember that some children's Hallowe'en costumes can be extremely flammable. There have been some horrific accidents in recent years. Check the labelling in any costumes you buy and tell your child to take care when near an open flame. Also, consider using LED lights in pumpkins instead of candles. If you do use candles, be extra careful both inside and outside the home. Bonfires and nuisance fires can quickly spiral out of control causing devastation to the community and even risking lives. If possible, attend an organised display rather than holding bonfires and hosting firework displays at home. Professional displays are bigger, brighter and much safer for yourself and your local community.

## **Digital Safety**

I have been introduced to an invaluable website for parents <u>www.internetmatters.org/</u>. This is a website established by BT, Sky and TalkTalk to address safeguarding on devices and in gaming. It contains everything that you need to know about setting parental controls on different devices, with printable PDF versions of instructions. If you do give your child a mobile, current advice suggests that you give your old phones to your children rather than buy new/different models for them. In this way parents can control the settings on the phone because they are familiar with the phone. The app 'ourpact' is definitely worth investigating if you want to extend your parental controls. It establishes a 'pact' between your device and your child's device.
