It's been amazing to see the variety of Sleepouts happening across the country and we're grateful to everyone that has braved a cold or uncomfortable night and slept in some interesting and unusual places! **You have raised an amazing £2616.75\* towards our work with the most vulnerable and at risk in our communities. Thank you so much.** We are proud that in 2021, despite the ongoing challenges of the pandemic, our Positive Pathways programme



supported 459 people experiencing homelessness. This support enabled them to access a safe space, material resources and training, accommodation, and support to increase their income.

# Polite reminders

#### Safety at the end of the day

The playground is very busy at the end of the day and my staff continually notice young children playing on the equipment and sometimes with little supervision. While the equipment is tempting for children to play on it is only to be used in school time with teacher supervision. In this way we are able to avoid accidents or any serious incidents.

**Dog fouling and mess** – Unfortunately, a number of parents and children have raised the issue of dog excrement around school. This does present a real challenge for our brilliant caretaker Mr Wilkins and a significant threat to health and safety in the school.

Please note that dogs are not allowed on the school grounds. We have a number of children who are nervous of dogs and when the school is busy I am sure that this is never a good environment for a dog.

**Car Parking** – This continues to be a problem that is reported weekly. I ask that where possible you walk to school and if that is not possible, park further away from school to avoid the congestion on Church Road and other surrounding roads.
