After an initial introduction altogether, the children split into 5 groups (House Teams) and moved around the 5 stations to learn more about aspects of Holy Week. These stations were: The Washing of Feet, Palm Sunday, The Last Supper, The Garden of Gethsemane and The Tomb. We all then gathered together again as a year group at the end for final reflections and prayer.

This year felt even more special as it is the first time we have had Experience Easter back in church since before the Covid pandemic.

We have all loved our time in church and learned more about Easter. We are very grateful to the friends at our church for all their hard work, time and energies. We had a lot of fun together.



Reading – Using our Accelerated Reader Programme

We are delighted to see the Accelerated Reader Programme start to have a positive impact on pupils' engagement with Reading in school and thank you to the PTA for funding this last year. We have seen children across the school begin to think about challenging themselves with their reading in order to hit self-set targets and challenges. This week one Year 5 class managed to reach an impressive word target of 900,000 words and have used this information to set themselves the target of 1,000,000 words in a school week. This kind of engagement and enjoyment of reading can only have a positive impact on the children's reading outcomes and we cannot wait to continue developing this with the children.
