This certainly helped to reduce the crush due to sheer numbers that we sometimes have in school. The Grotto, to see Father Christmas, was fantastic and very popular. I know the queue was very long and we have already discussed plans to shorten this for next year. Some of you may also have taken the opportunity to have a look at the wonderful Charles Dawson Brown Museum, this provides a number of links to local history which we will be using to develop our curriculum for September 2014.
